Upon completion of this program the student will be able to:

- 2. Identify the difference between being HIV positive and having AIDS.
- 3. Name the four main fluids that can transmit HIV.
- 4. Name three effective ways to provide protection from HIV.
- 5. Identify one physical and one emotional advantage of sexual abstinence until marriage.
- 6. Identify why some people live longer with HIV than others.
- 7. Give one reason why the use of alcohol and other drugs may increase the risk of HIV infection.
- 8. List four ways HIV is NOT transmitted.
